Abstract: (a few lines describing the course that SEA-EU partners can use for dissemination)	This course program responds directly to the horizontal priorities of the Erasmus+ program, by integrating: *Inclusion and Diversity, through the valorisation of local knowledge, the participation of less representative regions and the promotion of dialogue between different cultural and social contexts; *Ecological Transition, by addressing sustainable development in a transversal way in the areas of heritage, food and regional innovation and raising awareness of various principles that they can adopt to reduce carbon and environmental footprints in their activities; *Digital Transformation, using collaborative and interactive platforms in the virtual component and the creation of shareable digital products among participants, as well as providing an innovative vision based on examples of good technological practices from local companies and entrepreneurs; *Participation in Democratic Life, promoting active citizenship, community involvement and European awareness of the participants.

	The proposal is also of great strategic relevance by enhancing the transfer of good practices between local and international contexts, strengthening the role of higher education institutions in promoting a more cohesive, resilient and sustainable Europe, as well as creating conditions for future projects of strategic cooperation, research/action and joint curriculum development synchronized with the Development Goals of the 2030 Agenda.

Learn strategies to reinforce sustainable practices associated with culture, food, local and international production and conscious consumption, based on the principles of the Mediterranean Diet and other intercultural traditions.</p>
Description of the physical component (please include any relevant information for the applicants) – 35 ECTS credit	<p>Day 1: 22-06-2026 (7 hours)</p> <p>Session I - Coastal Histories: Shaping Identities Across Europe</p> <p>Objective: To explore the historical trajectories of SEA-EU coastal cities and to understand how their strategic positions have influenced identity, trade, cultural exchange and urban development.</p> <p>Expected learning outcomes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Recognize the multicultural historical foundations of European coastal cities. 2. Reflect on the construction of identity through contact, migration and maritime exchange. <p>Day 2: 23-06-2026 (7 hours)</p> <p>Session II - Cultural Identity in Coastal Contexts</p> <p>Objective: To analyze contemporary cultural practices and explore how traditions are maintained, adapted or challenged in coastal urban environments.</p>

Expected learning outcomes:

1. Reflect on cultural identity and transformation in contemporary Europe.
2. Critically engage with the impact of tourism, migration and globalisation.

Day 3: 24-06-2026 (7 hours)

Session III - Coastal Heritage: Tangible and Intangible Dimensions

Objective: To identify and enhance the cultural, architectural and natural heritage of coastal regions within the framework of the SEA-EU Alliance.

Expected learning outcomes:

1. Develop strategies for sustainable heritage management.
2. Understand the interconnections between ecological and coastal cultural heritage.

Day 4: 25-06-2026 (7 hours)

Session IV - Coastal Gastronomy – Cultural Tradition, Creativity and Sustainability

Objective: To explore the culinary traditions of European coastal regions, emphasizing sustainability, health and local identity.

Expected learning outcomes:

1. Appreciate the cultural significance of regional gastronomic traditions.
2. Apply principles of sustainability, seasonality and conscious consumption.
3. Develop intercultural communication, creativity and teamwork.

Day 5: 26-06-2026 (7 hours)

Session V: Innovation, Resilience and the Future of Coastal Europe

Objective: To reflect on the challenges and opportunities of coastal cities in the light of climate change, digitalization, depopulation and economic diversification.

Expected learning outcomes:

1. Engage with real-world challenges through a participatory lens.
2. To connect tradition, identity and innovation in regional development strategies.
