Abstract:	<p>A symposium for administrative staff involved in SEA-EU joint study programmes will bring together knowledge and experiences in programme management. It will cover administrative coordination, student experience and mobility, and quality management fostering collaboration between scholars and administrators. Key topics include organizing and coordinating inter-university activities, supporting incoming and outgoing students, and optimizing processes related to student documentation. This symposium will focus on strengthening administrative capacities and collaboration across SEA-EU joint study programmes. Participants will engage in integrative workshops to get to know colleagues from different countries and develop a shared understanding of administrative roles in transnational programmes. Attendees will explore best practices, common challenges, and build a common operational language.</p>	<p>A symposium for academic staff will focus on the educational aspects of cooperation. Key issues will include a collaborative analysis of the program's implementation to date, as well as a comparison of various approaches and experiences across different universities. It will concentrate on the development of joint study programmes from identifying current challenges to analyze teaching methods, and the overall student experience.</p> <p>Participants will explore organisational and academic barriers, while working together to develop shared standards and good practices. The overall goal is to create practical recommendations and transferable solutions for joint study programmes. Participants will engage in integrative workshops to get to know each other, explore different teaching experiences, and build trust across institutions and countries.</p>
	<p>The symposium will also include joint sessions where administrative participants and academic staff can interact and integrate, providing opportunities to better understand all processes, share perspectives, and strengthen collaboration across roles and institutions.</p>
